disting feast returns

For the second year, the Canton of Akornebir held its winter tavern Disting Feast at the Waitsburg Town Hall, and people came from near and far to eat, fight, and fellowship. Named after the traditional Norse celebration to mark the end of winter and the sowing of new crops, this Disting Feast included the baronial court of Baron William and Baroness Anna, along with several classes, live music, a served feast, and a rapier tavern brawl.

The Canton hosted its rapier championship alongside its yearly tournament for arts and sciences. After the judges inspected several worthy entrees, like a hand-crafted wooden chest and burned-wood art, Mistress Ciosa was named A&S champion, and she was actually wearing her competition item a beautifully handmade Renaissance gown. The German-served feast was excellently prepared by Honorable Lady Kaitlin and her team of chefs. The Rapier championship was won by Lord Cuthbert, while Master Thorkell emerged victorious with the Skullduggery cloak, despite serving as

marshal of the tournament!

To end the day, during court, after Baronessa Julia Sempronia was named Honorary Citizen of Wastekeep, Baronial bardic champion Lord Panfilo surprised the crowd with witty stories and songs.

The Canton of Akornebir is a branch of the Society for Creative Anachronism, Inc. We are located at the foot of the Blue Mountains, in Walla Walla, Washington. Our area includes all of Walla Walla County and the Waitsburg/Dayton area. Akornebir became an official branch of the Society in June, 2001 (A.S. XXXVI). Citizens of Akornebir have for many



years been affectionately known as Squirrels.

The Canton of Akornebir continues to work hard to pay its taxes to the Barony of Wastekeep through the making of largesse, specifically by cutting out and sewing fabric bags. This undertaking was the arts-and-sciences activity chosen for a pair of scurries in recent weeks, hosted by Svala and Kjartan at their house in Dayton, and then by Cuthbert and Lauren in College Place.

Crafting largesse donations for the barony serves as an opportunity to not only learn a new historical skill, but also to provide the baron and baroness with prizes and giveaways for award winners and newcomers at future events.

Each scurry brought canton members together for some sandwiches, while they also worked on some individual projects, like Fausto's ukulele-lute music and Kjartan's wood carving. The group cut out and sewed satchel cloth bags, first by preparing and pinning the fabric at Svala's and then using Lauren's sewing machine to bring it all together. While Cuthbert tried not to get the thread all tangled up, Mistress Gudrun was able to demonstrate to everyone else just how fast it can actually be done. Now that the nicer weather is here, and the camping events have started, indoor scurries will likely be replaced by some outdoor artand-science gatherings, possibly in coordination with fight practices in the park. finding new fighters







The Canton of Akornebir has been holding a mini-recruitment drive the last few weeks, and fighter practices have seen an increase in attendance, with half a dozen new fencers picking up a sword to try their hand at combat. Some visitors had prior experience in Olympicstyle fencing, others with HEMA, but for most it was a new activity.

Baron Thorkell, Lords William and Cuthbert, along with James and other canton members, all helped introduce our newcomers to rapier fencing and told them more about other things that the Society for Creative Anachronism has to offer.

After an online notice was posted in a couple of local Facebook groups, several interested parties got in contact, and the regular canton practice swelled with teens and their parents, as well as others of all ages wanting to learn.

In between Monday sessions, Lord Cuthbert and Baron Thorkell were also able to attend Oasis War to kick off the war-and-camping season and get some fencing practice in with other out-of-area fighters.

Be sure to come to practice on Monday, April 7 as some out-ofarea Masters of Defense are planning to make an appearance to fight and help teach too.

Over the past few years, our newsletter The Jousting Squirrel has interviewed a different member of the canton each issue about service and how to give back to the SCA in different ways.

We would like to thanks both Svala and Kjartan for demonstrating this concept when they hosted a fabric scurry at their house recently, as one of our winter Arts and Sciences get-togethers.

Jousting Squirrel: Thank you for answering our questions today! What is you names, both in the SCA and in real mundane life, as well as your hometown, and number of years you've been involved in the SCA?

Svala: My name is Svala, but I don't have a last name yet. My mundane name is Jennifer Sublett. I live in Dayton, and I've been involved off and on for over twenty years.

Jousting Squirrel: What are some of the things you enjoy doing in the SCA, your favorite activities, hobbies or ways to get involved?

Jousting Squirrel: What are some good ways for attendees to be of service at SCA events, and how have you enjoyed helping out in the past, perhaps with families or kids?

I think that really is the best thing that SCA offers.

The Road to Burgundy by Ray Walker Review written by Cuthbert Weaver

Ray Walker's *Road to Burgundy* is at its core an SCA instructional manual for the arts and sciences, even if the author did not intend for it to be so.

This passionate travel memoir begins in San Francisco where Walker begins to question his life in corporate finance, and instead dedicates himself to understanding how his favorite wine from Burgundy is made. When he brings his family from California to France, Walker quickly learns how overwhelming the process of winemaking can be, that not everyone in Burgundy can be trusted, and that the ancient magic of turning French grapes into alcohol is far less complicated than the bureaucracy for Americans trying to start a business in the European Union.

When he does start to make his own vintage, he does so by avoiding most modern methods, instead embracing slower, older, and gentler techniques. In a real-life project that would make the judges at Kingdom Arts and Sciences swoon, Walker emulates the centuries-old traditions of French wine-making in Burgundy—from sorting the grape clusters by hand, through their mysterious fermentation process, to eventually even storing them in an old medieval-style cave.

An inspiring role model for lifelong learners, Walker has to quickly adapt to the French language, negotiate and get investors on board, as well as master the history of the region and its knowledge of local soils, vines and climates.

I got lost trying not to confuse one chateau with another, but the book is a great read for people who have always wanted to pursue an impossible dream, or for those yearning to travel across continents or back in time to a slower era. -FRANCES MAYES, author of Under the Tuscan Su RAY WALKER
