maitsburg iron & ink

This past weekend, from June 13 to 15, the popular hands-on arts and sciences event, and Ink. was held within the boundaries of the Canton of Akornebir and formally hosted by the College of Lyonsmarche. Dame Katherine and Lord Neil were incredibly gracious welcomed dozens of campers, cooks, artists and guests onto their Waitsburg property for the weekend where artisans and Laurels hosted intricate and complex classes on things like making ink, stamping fabric patterns, cooking over hot coals, enamel painting, lamp work bead crafting and more. There were even opportunities for attendees to bury and fire pottery in an below-ground earth-mound kiln, groups of heavy fighters and dancers mingled while practicing their respective footwork in perfect weather.

Iron and Ink has long been a favorite among the Inlands arts and sciences (A&S) community for its heavy focus on hands-on workshops that each take a couple hours. Attendees are also given a no-garb option to keep contaminants away from clothing. Members also enjoyed delicious group meals cooked by Mistress Gudrun, an evening potluck in garb, a cut-and-thrust session, and a Sunday morning where potters uncovered their ceramics from where the pieces baked under the soil.

The Canton of Akornebir is a branch of the Society for Creative Anachronism, Inc. We are located at the foot of the Blue Mountains, in Walla Walla, Washington. Our area includes all of Walla Walla County and the Waitsburg/Dayton area. Akornebir became an official branch of the Society in June, 2001 (A.S. XXXVI). Citizens of Akornebir have for many



years been affectionately known as Squirrels.

The Society for Creative Anachronism, Inc. (SCA) is a non-profit group dedicated to researching and recreating the Middle Ages in the present.

The Canton of Akornebir is located in the Kingdom of An Tir (Irish translation: Our Land), in the area formerly known as the Inland Region. Locally, the Canton of Akornebir is a part of the Barony of Wastekeep. Its territory includes the Canton of Akornebir, and any 993xx zip codes within Benton, Franklin and Walla Walla counties and, through previous negotiations, including Grandview, which is in Yakima county.

Recent monthly business meetings, both within the canton and the wider baronial family, have been a flurry of in-person activity as summer brings changes to each group. The baronial business meeting was held in person for the month of June at Round Table Pizza as part of a continued new initiative to get the barony together for social business meals once a quarter.

A planning group then went to the Three Rivers Convention Center in Tri-Cities to visit the site for July Coronation, which is being hosted by a team from Akornebir, Wastekeep and beyond. Happening on the weekend of July 11-13, this particular event will be a rarity for July Coronation as it will be held inside, and therefore attendees will get to enjoy the air-conditioning that isn't available at usual camping summer coronations.

Just a few days before the Wastekeep in-person meeting, Akornebir held its own monthly business session in Pioneer Park, the usual site of its weekly rapier practices. Both the meetings and practices have seen an increase in new attendees with the fighter group continuing to grow with between 3-5 new fencers learning each session. In an important piece of canton business, officers voted to elect Dame Katherine again as Seneschal replacing Master Thorkell.

Hands-on sword-fighting lessons were given by local rapier fighters James, Cuthbert, Thorkell, William Le Navetier, Baron William, Alex, Steve and others. Those students waiting their turn enjoyed relaxing under the tall trees, eating pizza, and chatting about Norse culture with Kjartan. This is the third year that history or English clubs from WWU have joined Akornebir for a fight practice, and we hope it long continues!

Jousting Squirrel: What is your name, both in the SCA and in real or "mundane" life, as well as your hometown, and number of years you've been involved in the SCA?

Cuthbert: My name is Cuthbert Weaver in the SCA and Martin Surridge in mundane life. I'm originally from Watford, England, but Northern California is more recently where I'm from. I'm coming up on three years as a member of the SCA.

Jousting Squirrel: What are some of the things you enjoy doing in the SCA, your favorite activities, hobbies or ways to get involved?

Cuthbert: I love to play classical guitar, especially medieval hymns, and I'm marshal for our local rapier fighters' group. I've enjoy painting charters and watercolor scenes, but researching and writing about the Twelfth Century Renaissance is my biggest passion.

Jousting Squirrel: What are some good ways for attendees to be of service at SCA events, and how have you enjoyed helping out in the past?

Cuthbert: Show up early and stay late. Help set up and take down. I also like the organizational side of things: communications, recruitment, etc.





Jousting Squirrel: What do you think are some of the less visible and less obvious ways that people serve in the SCA?

Cuthbert: The financial side of running events and branches in the SCA seems challenging, and it doesn't garner a lot of attention. There are a lot of legal requirements with insurance and liability that have rules we need to follow. I appreciate those gentles who serve the society in this way, making it so that we can have fun.

Jousting Squirrel: Who has been someone in the SCA who you've seen that demonstrates service in a remarkable way?

Cuthbert: When I first joined the SCA, Duchess Stjarna personally made custom clothing for me, teaching me how to sew and measure the fabric over multiple sessions together. I still wear those outfits nearly every event, and I'm very grateful for the ways that she serves others and the society at large.

Jousting Squirrel: As a registered educational non-profit, how does the SCA provide service and teaching to the people of Akornebir, here in the Walla Walla Valley?

Cuthbert: My first event was a Newcomers weekend in Waitsburg, and I learned so much about medieval life and

how their world functioned. I know others who attended also came away with a great appreciation for the many volunteers who taught us about heraldry, armored combat, etiquette and more. I'm excited about the possibility of another Newcomer's event here soon.

Jousting Squirrel: What advice would you give to someone who wants to help out within their canton or barony?

Cuthbert: Volunteer for an office, attend the business meetings, connect with others, and stay involved. Come to as many events as you can.

Jousting Squirrel: What are some of your favorite memories over the years of SCA in the Walla Walla Valley, as well as beyond the canton limits?

Cuthbert: Locally, I really like when we transform the Waitsburg Town Hall into a medieval tavern, complete with a rapier food fight accompanied by live music in the background. I also love learning at the larger convention-style events like Collegium and Kingdom Arts & Sciences.



A History of the World in 6 Glasses by Tom Standage Review written by Cuthbert Weaver


Many people when they sit down for their morning latte, afternoon tea, or an evening glass of wine might consider their drink's *place* of origin, whether it's an Ethiopian coffee, Japanese matcha, French champagne, or something else entirely. But how often does someone think about the *history* of these beverages? That's what Tom Standage does in his excellent book *A History of the World in Six Glasses*. Standage chronicles the dawn and expansion of global civilizations through their consumption of beer, wine, spirits, coffee, tea, and cola.


Each section and each corresponding beverage follows the story of a different part of the world and how its past would not have been possible if it weren't for those who drank one of these six history-changing liquids. He begins with the Mesopotamians who used beer as a currency, cash crop, and staple calories for their diet. He then chronicles the history of wine and proposes that the cultivation of grapes helped give rise to the great societies of ancient Rome and Greece. Hard liquor and coffee made the modern world possible, Standage argues, during the eras of revolution, enlightenment, and exploration.

Those British explorers who then became colonizers fueled a global empire using tea from Asia, and modern American capitalism built on these trade networks to ship Coca-Cola to every marketplace on the planet.

Like a good history book should, Standage's nonfiction narrative spins statistics into great stories. It deserves a place on any SCA bookshelf and would be well enjoyed by the society's wine afficionados, food historians, craft beer brewers, and those who can't start an event without their morning hit of caffeine.
